COMMENTS INVITED ON RECREATION USE OPTIONS IN KOOCANUSA AREA Open houses begin January 31

(East Kootenay) – The public will have a chance to discuss and provide feedback about recreation management in the Koocanusa area at four open houses and through an online survey this January and February.

The Koocanusa Recreation Steering Committee and the Koocanusa Recreation Public Advisory Group are hosting the open houses to gather feedback on management options, appropriate recreational uses and stewardship activities around the Koocanusa Reservoir. The Koocanusa area is an important tourism and recreation area, attracting outdoor enthusiasts for a wide range of activities. It is also an area of traditional use and interest for the Ktunaxa Nation.

The open houses are from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at:

- January 31 at the Cranbrook Heritage Inn
- February 1 at the Grasmere Pioneer Hall
- February 7 at the Fernie Family Centre
- February 8 at the Jaffray Community Hall

The management options aim to maintain the important recreation opportunities while reducing the issues arising from increased tourism and recreation on Crown land. These issues include degradation of sensitive grasslands and wildlife habitat, impacts on important cultural and archaeological resources, excessive litter and garbage in the backcountry, and growing public health and safety concerns.
